Item No. 3: Election for Presidential Group, Board of Directors and Internal Auditor

WTA Constitution

Article 13. Executive Officers

The WTA shall have one World President and four(4) Vice-Presidents.

Article 15. Election

- 1. The World President, Vice-Presidents shall be elected by the General Assembly of the WTA.
- 2. Among the four (4) Vice-Presidents, one shall be nominated by the World President as the First Vice-President.

Article 16. Terms of Office

- 1. The World President, and Vice-Presidents shall be elected for a term of four (4) years. They are eligible for re-election without term limitation. (Revised on Feb 26, 2014)
- 2. The terms of office for those elected in a by-election shall be the remaining period of the predecessor's term of office.

Article 23. Functions

The General Assembly shall have the authority:

1. To elect or remove members of the Board and auditors;

Article 25. Composition

- 1. The Board shall consist of the following posts:
- 1. Ten (10) or fewer elected Directors; and
- 2. Two (2) Directors nominated by the World President
- 3. Two (2) Directors nominated by the Presidential Group

Article 26. Election

The Directors stipulated under paragraph 1c Article 25 shall be elected by the General Assembly of the WTA, taking into account the need for better geographical representation.

Article 27. Terms of Office

1. Members of the Board shall be elected for a term of four (4) years at the General Assembly. They are eligible for without term limitation.

The directors nominated by the World President and Presidents shall serve for such period as the World President shall decide.
